Brief Description of Duckworth Worcestershire Trust

The Duckworth Worcestershire Trust, a registered charity, was established in 1998 by the former chairman of Worcester Heat Systems, Mr Cecil Duckworth.

We are dedicated to the conservation, protection and enhancement of the natural and built environments for the people of Worcestershire. We also aim to relieve poverty amongst those who are disadvantaged and have an equal opportunities policy in place.

The Environmental Warden Team has been working in and around Worcestershire for over 10 years and was the first project of the Duckworth Worcestershire Trust. As well as practical conservation work in woodlands, school grounds and local nature reserves, the wardens work with local agencies to preserve and protect Worcestershire's varied environments.

Role Description

The DWT Environmental Warden Team undertakes practical conservation tasks such as tree planting, coppicing, hedge laying, scrub and ground clearance in the winter plus habitat management for wildlife, nettle clearance, pruning and soft landscape projects in the spring and summer months.

Training and Requirements

Following the application process and two references, training in tools and safety concerns are given on site. Information on welfare and first aiders present is included in the building orientation and induction arranged before a taster session is arranged at a date suitable to the volunteer.

A CRB enhanced disclosure check may be required.

Volunteers will be responsible to the DWT Environmental Wardens on site.

Due to the physical nature of the work a reasonable level of fitness and dexterity is required .

All tools, training and PPE are given on site. The volunteer will need appropriate footwear, warm/waterproof clothing which potentially could get damaged and dirty plus a packed lunch. Hot drinks and biscuits are provided on site.
